

Guidelines for Suspensions

You have a duty to ensure that your child is not present in a public place in school hours during the first five school days of suspension. Please be aware that you may be prosecuted or receive a penalty notice from the local authority if your child is present in a public place on the specified dates without reasonable justification. It will be for you to show that there is reasonable justification for this.

Students are expected to complete work from home during the period of the suspension.

- Students must check Google Classroom and complete work that their teachers have uploaded.
- Students are expected to complete the homework as per the instructions where homework has been set, including any online quizzes.
- Work completed at home should take the equivalent of 6 x 55 minutes each day, to mirror the learning time in school.
- Any questions can be emailed to the subject teacher.
- Support materials can be found on Google classroom, subject Google Sites and the SParkO.

You and your child are required to attend a reintegration interview with a member of the pastoral team. You will be contacted by a member of the pastoral/behaviour team to schedule the meeting. If that is not convenient, please contact the school before your child is due to return to arrange a suitable alternative date and time. The purpose of the reintegration interview is to discuss how best your child's return to school can be managed. Failure to attend a reintegration interview will be a factor taken into account by a magistrates' court if, on future application, they consider whether to impose a parenting order on you.
